Budget Summary**

The Governor's Budget for FY10/ FY11 issued February 4, 2009 proposes bonding for private providers in several accounts:

Agency	Program	FY10	FY11	Comments
DCF	Grants-in-aid for construction, alteration, repairs and improvements to residential facilities, group homes, shelters and permanent family residences	\$1,250,000	\$1,250,000	Agency had requested \$2,500,000 in each year
DCF	Grants-in-aid to private nonprofit organizations for construction and renovation of private nonprofit clinics	\$500,000	\$500,000	Agency also requested \$500,000 in each year
DMHAS	Grants-in-aid to private nonprofit organizations ...for community-based residential and outpatient facilities for purchases, repairs, alterations and improvements	\$0	\$2,000,000	Agency had requested \$6 M in each year
DSS	Grants-in-aid for neighborhood facilities, child day care projects, elderly centers, multipurpose human resource centers, shelters	\$0	\$0	Agency had requested \$2 M in each year
