

Nonprofits to have emergency meeting

Hartford (AP) – A group of nonprofit social service agencies, struggling financially because of Connecticut's budget impasse, has scheduled an emergency meeting with the state social services commissioner.

Tuesday's meeting with Commissioner Michael Starkowski is the first of several that the Connecticut Association of Community Providers is lining up with state agency heads to discuss their difficult fiscal situations.

Alyssa Goduti, the group's vice president for public policy, says many have had to cut back services to the mentally ill, disabled and others. This month's executive order issued by Gov. M. Jodi Rell, to run state government without a budget in place, reduced funding to groups serving the mentally ill by 20 percent.

Goduti says the agencies can't stomach additional funding reductions without cutting more services.
